CASOATM Methods and Goals

Assessment Objectives

- ✓ Identify community strengths and weaknesses
- ✓ Articulate the specific needs of older adults in the community
- ✓ Develop estimates and projections of resident need in the future

Assessment Methods

- ✓ Multi-contact mailed survey
- ✓ Representative sample of 1,000households of residents age 65+
- ✓ 349 surveys returned; 5% margin of error
- ✓ 36% response rate
- ✓ Data statistically weighted to reflect population

Assessment Goals

Immediate

- ✓ Useful information for:
 - ✓ Planning
 - ✓ Resource allocation and development
 - ✓ Advocacy
 - ✓ Engagement

Intermediate

- ✓ Improved program mix
- ✓ Better quality programs
- ✓ More effective policies

Respondent Characteristics

- ✓ 40% lived in Novi for more than 20 years
- √ 18% had income of less than \$25,000
- ✓ Age distribution
 - ✓ 27% 55 to 59
 - √ 43% 60 to 74
 - ✓ 18% 75 to 84
 - √ 12% 85 and over

- ✓ 37% live alone
- ✓ 94% registered to vote
- ✓ 57% fully retired
- ✓ Race and ethnicity
 - ✓ 92% white
 - ✓ 8% not white
 - √ 1% Hispanic





Recommending Novi


How likely or unlikely are you to recommend living in Novi to older adults?




Percent "very" or "somewhat" likely

Older Resident Needs




Risk Status of Older Adults



Recommendations

Recommendations

Opportunity: Civic Engagement

- ✓ Increase participation of older residents in local governing and community decision-making
- ✓ Actively promote senior volunteerism
- Consider community design and land use policy to "build community"

Opportunity: Community Design and Land Use

- ✓ Consider zoning regulations that encourage affordable housing options
- ✓ Provide education/technical assistance around home financing/financial planning
- Promote senior home assessments
- Support home modification and repair services

Recommendations

Opportunity: Physical & Mental Health

- ✓ Pursue programs that will attract medical providers and facilities to the region
- ✓ Coordinate medical services across counties and Area Agencies on Aging (AAAs)
- ✓ Provide attractive fitness opportunities for older residents
- ✓ Consider community design features to promote active-living communities
- Promote access to fruits, vegetables and healthy eating choices
 - Improve access to screening and mental health programs
