

**SPECIAL MEETING OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NOVI
SATURDAY, JANUARY 5, 2013 AT 9:00 A.M.
FIRE STATION 4 - 49375 W. TEN MILE ROAD**

Mayor Gatt called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

ROLL CALL: Mayor Gatt, Mayor Pro Tem Staudt, Council Members Casey, Fischer, Margolis, Mutch and Wrobel

1. Process Review

a. Today's Work

City Manager Pearson noted we are looking toward this next fiscal year beginning July 1, 2013 and beyond. We've done studies and surveys to give Council talking points including the Management Staff Retreat's brainstormed ideas, Boards and Commissions brainstormed ideas, tax base primer, 2012 citizen perception survey, older adults strategy, draft economic development goals, Preliminary CIP Summary and Mid-year Property Tax update as background information to discuss. There are limited resources but we have abilities to do things. Doubling the road millage gives us resources and additional opportunities to do more going forward. Mayor Gatt thanked staff for being present today.

2. Initial thoughts – roundtable discussion

Member Mutch stated his focus would be on short term goals and the upcoming budget year. Staff has done a great job incorporating ideas into upcoming budgets. Long term goals would be good to have the same goals in place and supplement those with a few additional goals and keep working on those.

Member Fischer thanked the staff for being present. He agreed with Member Mutch that there should be good discussion on what we need to do. He stated the key words for him were "cautious optimism" as we still need to make sure we are indeed seeing the bottom and see slow and steady growth. Everything we do revolves around the idea of doing all things with cautious optimism. Looking back at last year's goals, they were met and accomplished. It's good to know we don't do this in vain and the work today is the road map for the future.

Member Margolis noted this is her 8th year of goal setting and is a great process for getting this done. She is very impressed with the forecasting of staff as she pays attention to the staff along the way and it is what was predicted as far as the economy. Kudos to those who forecasted this as it was an excellent job of doing this. Council is very well positioned as we have cut back but not stopped doing the right investment things in the City including cultural things that are important. Her goals include infrastructure (due to the passage of road bond), and using what we've done to do economic development.

Member Casey looks forward to spending time together and appreciated reaching out to the boards and commissions for their input. She will be looking at economic development and also parks, recreation and cultural services.

Member Wrobel noted last year was a very good year and this year he hopes to keep things moving forward. Several items he will look at include the operational budget to make sure we are not dipping into fund balance, expenditures should not exceed revenue and long term goals being funded partially now rather than taking a big financial hit in other years. He also suggested updating the City Charter since it was last updated in 1978. Things have changed since then so it might be time to have discussion about possible changes for the way business is conducted now in the City.

Mayor Pro Tem Staudt stated his goals are achievable in the short term and looks at this as an opportunity for staff. He agrees it is time to delve into the Charter as there are some extremely antiquated things including accounting that need to be updated. He felt it was time to allocate funds in terms of looking at the ring road. Some business partners are being constrained by their location. It was also time to use some funds from road millage and the ring road is a primary economic development project. Another goal would be to look at fire station 1 and plan for a transition to another location. Will we need a facility to house people and equipment or include an administrative building? Also, his theme is long-term planning and for Council to consider looking at administrative employee compensation for 2-5 years out. It won't be binding but felt it was better to have a long term plan for long term projections as we can let future employees know what is expected for their future compensation. He would like to consider different ways of compensation to keep good employees. Also, put together a strategic plan using the State's trust fund grant, and other grants, along with the Parks foundation. We should know a year in advance based on Parks and Recreation master plan for what we want to do in the coming year. We are not out of the woods yet and don't know where we are with commercial buildings. Residential is increasing and that will help, but revenues and expenses are in line and we won't have to dip into fund balance to run the city.

Mayor Gatt agreed with everyone at the Council table being cautiously optimistic as the economy is still fragile. One goal, and it is number one, is providing public safety. We had 70 sworn officers authorized at one time and are now down to 62. Some years ago that was reduced and that number should be brought up by at least 1-2 immediately and long term bring those numbers up to what it was previously. Lakeshore Park should be a focus as it is a jewel that is not used to its full extent. Many people don't even know it's there and it isn't used in the winter as it could be used. Look at ways to use that park 12 months out of the year and regularly.

**3. Confirm Major Strategic Theme Categories –

a. City Council consensus was no changes were necessary to these categories:

- ◆ Ensure public safety services meet the needs of the community (Police, Fire, Public Services)
- ◆ Improve Infrastructure (Roads, Water and Sewer)
- ◆ Encourage economic development to maximize City revenue and job growth
- ◆ Develop government structure and staff skills for effective delivery of customer services and communication with community
- ◆ Be a community that values natural areas & natural features, and community character
- ◆ Maintain a fiscally responsible government
- ◆ Enhance park, recreation and cultural services

City Council brainstormed service improvements for each of the broad Strategic Themes outlined above.

City Council explained and clarified the list of service improvements. This is shown below as the edited list for short-term (next 18 months) and long-term (18 months plus and on-going) items input by Mayor and Council members for each of the 7 Strategic Themes.
